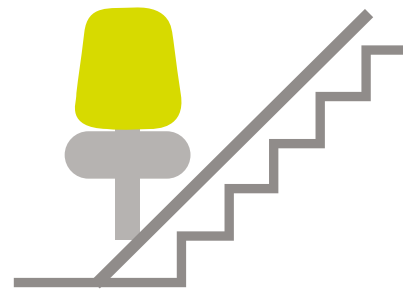


# Adapting your home if you're disabled



This leaflet explains how to apply for adaptations to your home, grants, and financial help

If you're disabled or elderly, you may find that there are some physical barriers that make it hard for you to carry out day-to-day activities. For example an adaptation like a stair lift may give you the freedom to move around your home with more ease. Having a stair lift fitted will also make it easier for your carers to look after you.

Some people prefer to arrange and pay for adaptations themselves instead of waiting for funding. If you wish to adapt your home yourself and you're able to do this financially, you will need to first get consent from our Home Improvements team.

A surveyor will come out to inspect your property. If they are happy with the proposed adaptations, they will give their consent for the work to go ahead.

If you require a minor adaptation to your home such as steps or handrails our in-house team at Curo may be able to install these or make these changes for you. Contact us if you'd like to do this.

## Financial help

If you need help paying for the costs of adapting your home you may be eligible for a Disabled Facilities Grant (DFG). This is available to people with a lower income. Higher income households may need to contribute towards the cost of the adaptation. You will need to speak to your local council about this threshold. Disabled children under 18 can get a grant without their parents' income being taken into account.



**Before applying for funding for a stair lift or other adaptation, you will first need an occupational therapist assessment which you arrange through your local council.**

(Please note that you might not get any grant if you start work on your property before the council approves your application).

You can arrange this by contacting your local council. You will find some useful contact information over the page.

Once you've been allocated an occupational therapist, they will assess your needs either at an assessment centre or at your home if you can't travel easily.

Following this the council will arrange a home visit to check that the proposed adaptations are practical. At this visit, you'll be helped to complete the Disabled Facilities Grant (DFG) application form if needed.

Our Customer Accounts team can also help you complete the DFG form, if needed.



# Adapting your home if you're disabled

A schedule of works will be written up and the council will contact Curo to discuss the adaptations required. An inspection will be completed by one of our surveyors too to make sure they meet our requirements and specifications.

Once everything has been approved the council will give you a couple of options for contractors who can do the work for you. You will need to choose the contractor that you wish to use.
