

## Redevelopment of Tintagel Close Community update

Curo is planning to demolish and redevelop Tintagel Close to provide modern, warm, and comfortable affordable homes for Social Rent and Shared Ownership. We want to improve the neighbourhood and integrate these new homes with the area, so we've also suggested some landscape and public space improvements.



In 2022, we asked your opinion on what to do next with the space. We used your views to create our designs, but now we need your help to finalise them... ## You said...

- 1. We want a mix of housing types, including accessible homes.
- 2. We need more parking.
- 3. We prefer houses over flats.
- 4. We're worried about noise, disruption, and overlooking issues.
- 5. Enhancing the area's appearance, safety, and community well-being is a priority.
- 6. We want homes that meet our needs, including storage space and sustainable features like solar panels and EV charging points.

## We did...

- 1. Our proposed layout includes 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom homes, with four flats suitable for wheelchair users. All of these homes will be for either social rent or shared ownership.
- 2. All the new homes will have parking, with 21 having car ports designed to reduce onstreet parking.
- 3. Most homes are houses, with 18 x 1-bed flats designed in small blocks of three to avoid large blocks of flats like the existing Tintagel Close building.
- 4. The homes are designed to avoid compromising privacy. We will work with any concerned residents before construction starts to avoid disruption.
- 5. Our designs will improve the open spaces for a welcoming, safer, and environmentally friendly scheme that prioritises community spaces.
- 6. The new homes will include storage space, air source heat pumps, and electric vehicle (EV) charging points.





- 01. Community space integrated with Queen's Road Methodist Church.
- 02. Entrances to the new homes that prioritise safety and enhance the look of the area.
- 03. Courtyards with greenery and convenient parking, perfect for gathering and pedestrian-friendly access.
- 04. Pedestrian access routes that allow close integration with existing streets.
- 05. Arrival space framed by a larger building set back into landscaped surroundings.
- 06. Parking areas overlooked by homes for security.
- 07. Landscaped arrival area, a focal point for residents and visitors alike.
- 08. Extension of Kelston Park with trails and natural play spaces.
- 09. Carefully oriented homes ensuring privacy for existing residents.
